GENERAL INFORMATION

REGISTRATION

Pre-Registration for workshops is required at least five business days prior to the date of the training to ensure space and materials for those attending.

PAYMENT

The cost for each training is \$25.00 per hour (unless otherwise noted). Scholarship funding to participate in these trainings may be available through the Educational Incentive Program (EIP). For more info. Visit www.tsg.suny.edu. You may also contact EIP at eip@tsp.suny.edu or 800-295-9616. (See page 13 for further info. Regarding EIP).

Payment is due prior to the training date. If you have applied for a scholarship from EIP to cover training costs and the money has not reached 5C's before the training date, you are responsible for payment. As soon as your scholarship money arrives from EIP, we will refund that amount directly to you.

Apply for EIP funding as soon as you decide which trainings you would like to attend. The training department will be glad to help you with the process.

There is a \$25.00 fee for returned checks.

CERTIFICATES

You are responsible for maintaining you workshop certificates and training records. There will be a \$2.00 fee for each duplicate certificate provided. A training record is included in this training catalog for your use (pg. 19)

FEBRUARY 6TH— FLEXIBLE, FEARFUL, OR FEISTY

The way infants relate to each other and to caregivers is influenced by temperament.. Children displaying different temperamental traits can create a challenging mix of needs and demands that compete for the caregiver’s time and attention. An understanding of temperament will help caregivers work with individuals and groups more effectively. **Topic Area 1**

FEBRUARY 13TH –THE AGES OF INFANCY

Children, birth through 2 need the caregiver’s help with the developmental issues of security, exploration, and identity. The importance of these issues changes as the child grows. Adapting care according to the child’s stage of development is the focus of this workshop. **Topic Areas 1,3**
